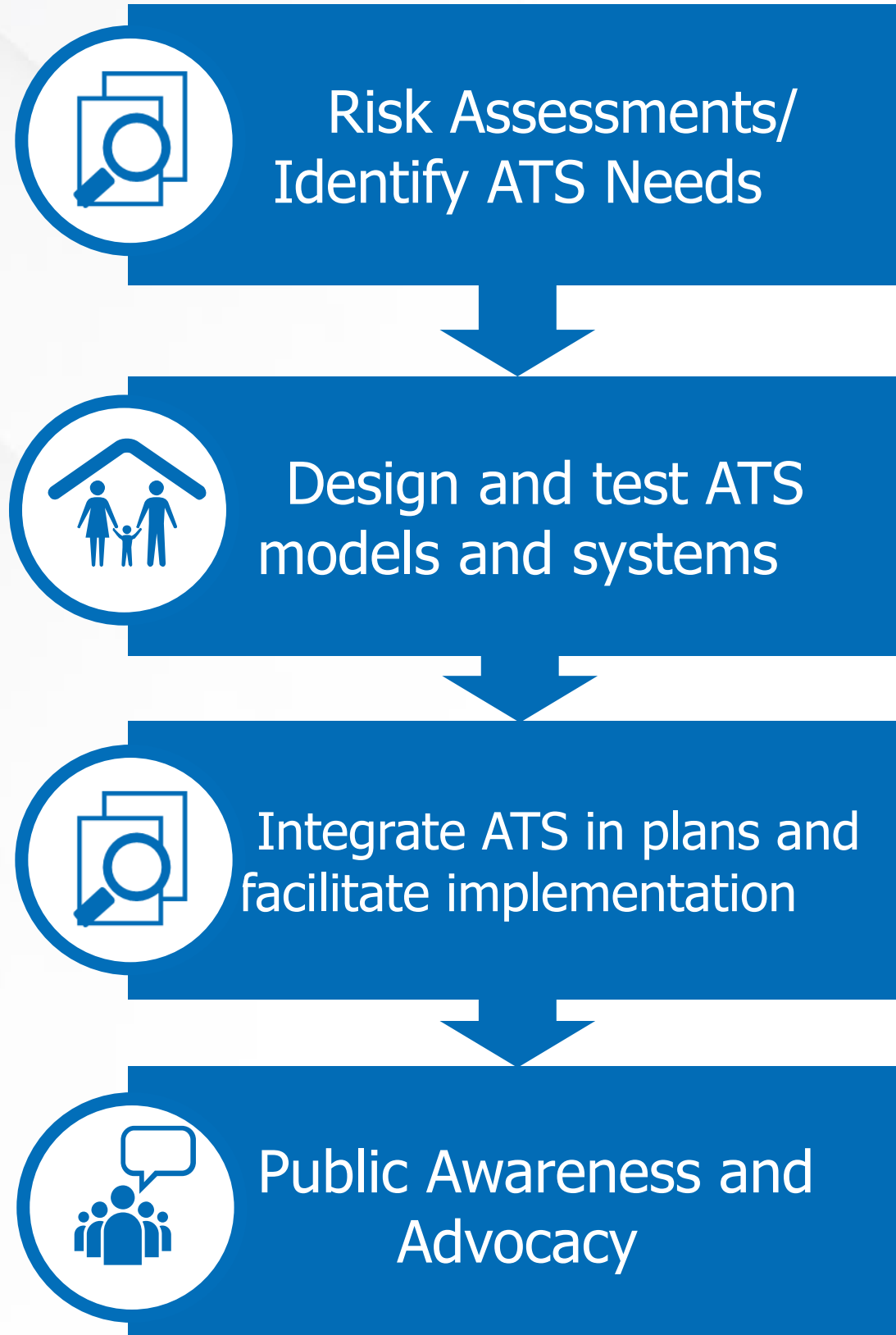

MOVEUP4 Interventions

- **Alternative Temporary Shelters:** access to and availability of risk informed ATS to address shelter needs.
- **Resilient Livelihood:** creating access to and facilitating alternative and diversified livelihood options (considering climate change impacts)
- **Social safety Nets:** advocate and seek synergies with existing social protection strategies to ensure urban poor access to early assistance

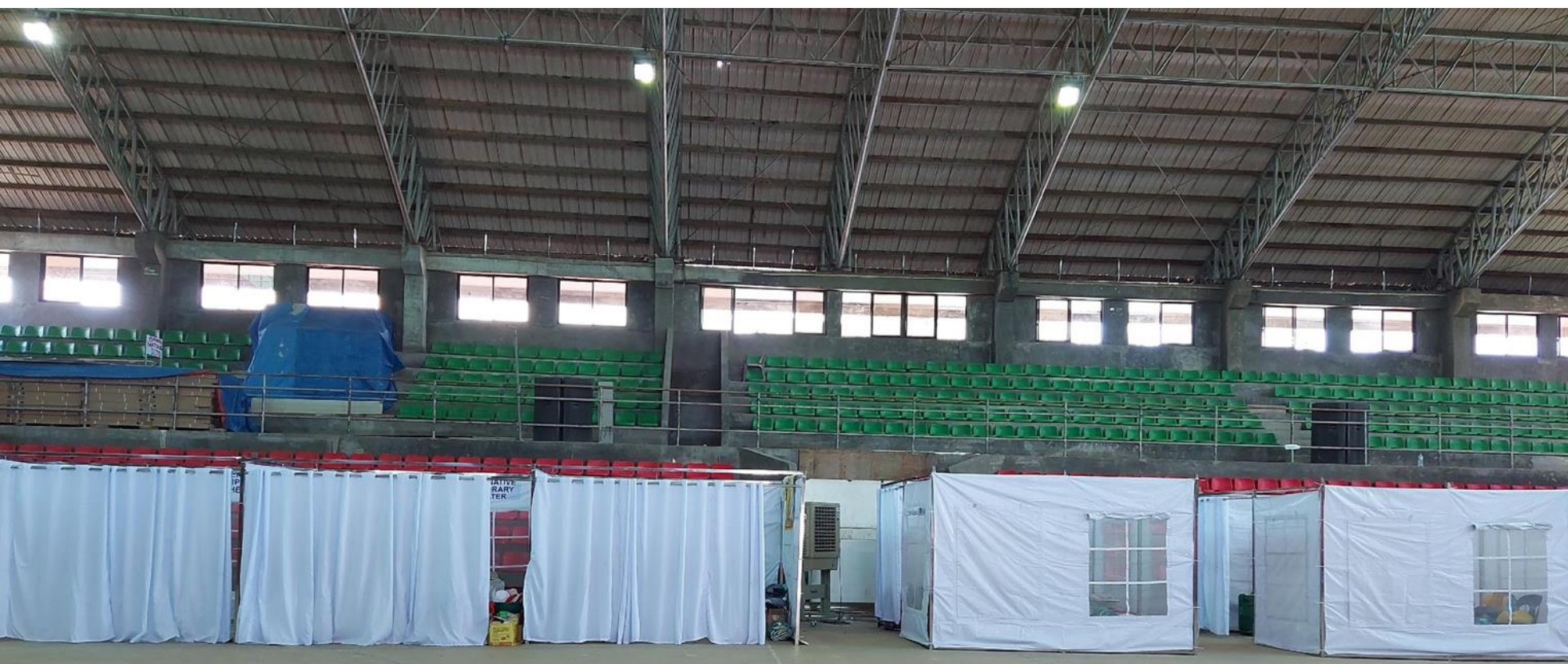

Alternative Diversification of Livelihood Options

- ✓ Organized Community Savings Groups (CSGs)
- ✓ CSG members foster change in behavior from **NO savings to a habit of saving**
- ✓ **Diversify climate informed and culture based alternative livelihood options (Islamic financing strategies and seasonal livelihood programming)**
- ✓ CSG members **enrolled in micro insurance with 60-40 % scheme** with their savings and project support
- ✓ CSGs **linked to cooperatives** and **LGUs livelihood and employment** departments
- ✓ Members of the CGS have **invested their loan in to livelihood activities** Linking **Communities to job fair of LGU thru DRR Caravan**

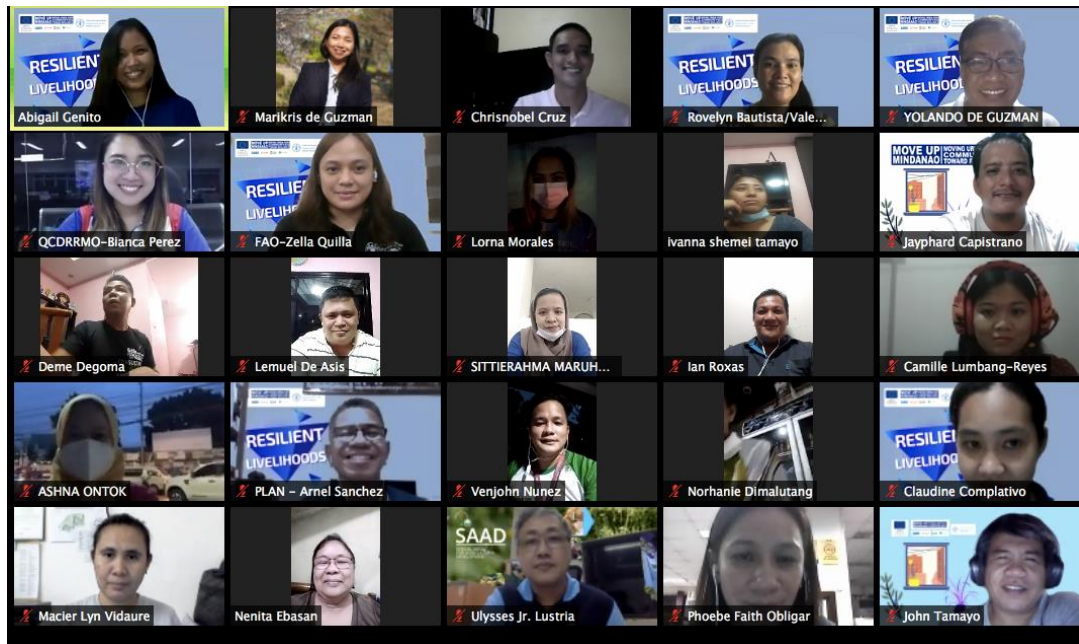

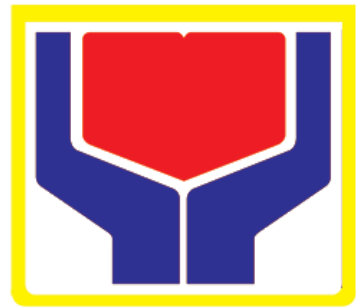

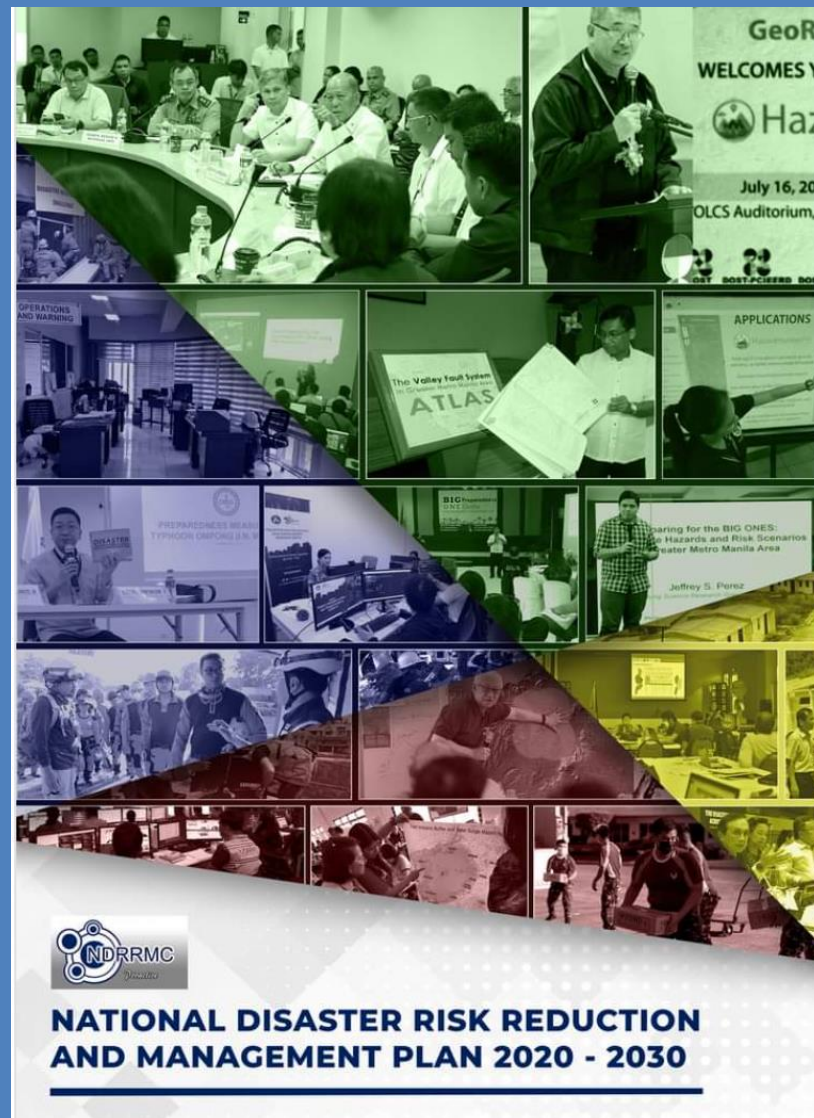
